2025-26 ATHLETICS VICTORIA SHIELD LEAGUE

Contested during the summer season, the Athletics Victoria Shield League (AVSL) is Athletics Victoria's premier track and field competition. With over 50 clubs and five AVSL divisions, clubs battle it out across ten rounds of AVSL to see who takes home the Shield, as well as promotion and relegation for the 2026/27 season.

Competing in Division Three, mainly in Geelong, we finished mid-table against larger clubs, despite facing additional travel barriers.

This competition allows our regional athletes to gain valuable experience on their journey to higher honours while also enjoying the camaraderie and excitement of team competition.

Many club records and personal bests were achieved over the season, including impressive top 10 state finishes for our male Under 14 and women's 40-44 year cohorts.





2025 ATHLETICS

VICTORIA XCR

The AV XCR season features seven individual cross-country rounds across Victoria, along with three relay events. ASW partners with the Geelong Region team to maximize team points.

Last season, we had a strong group of juniors which marked our largest XCR season yet, with 15 active members. Several of our junior athletes finished in the top 10 overall:

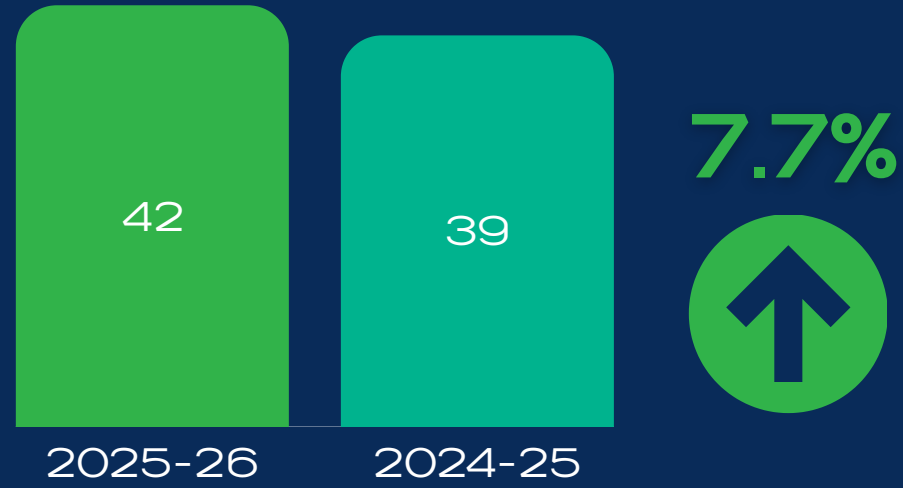

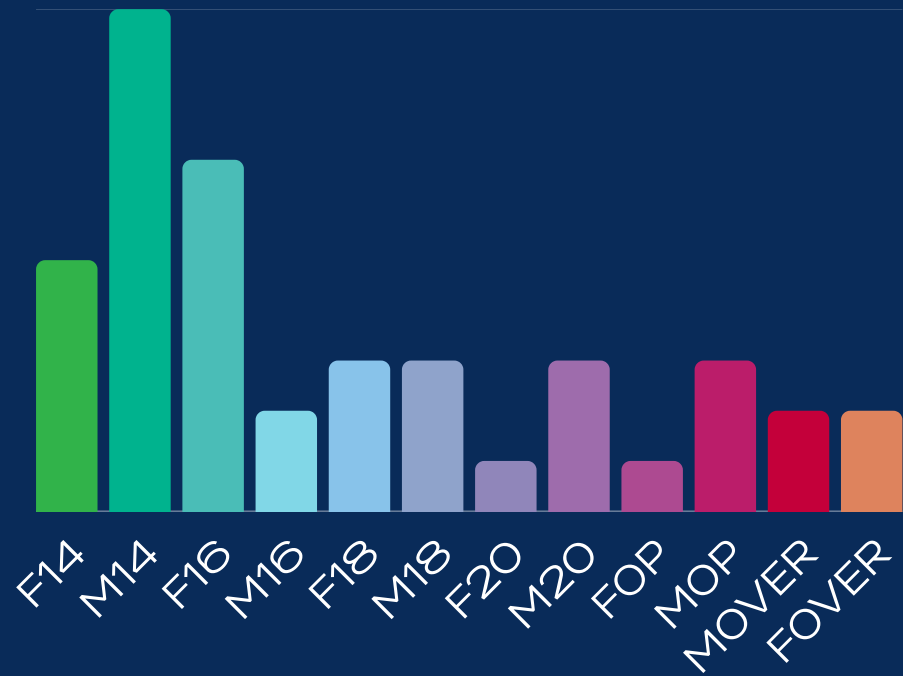
This result highlights the depth of talent emerging from regional South West Victoria and demonstrates that our young athletes can compete strongly against some of the largest metropolitan clubs in the state.

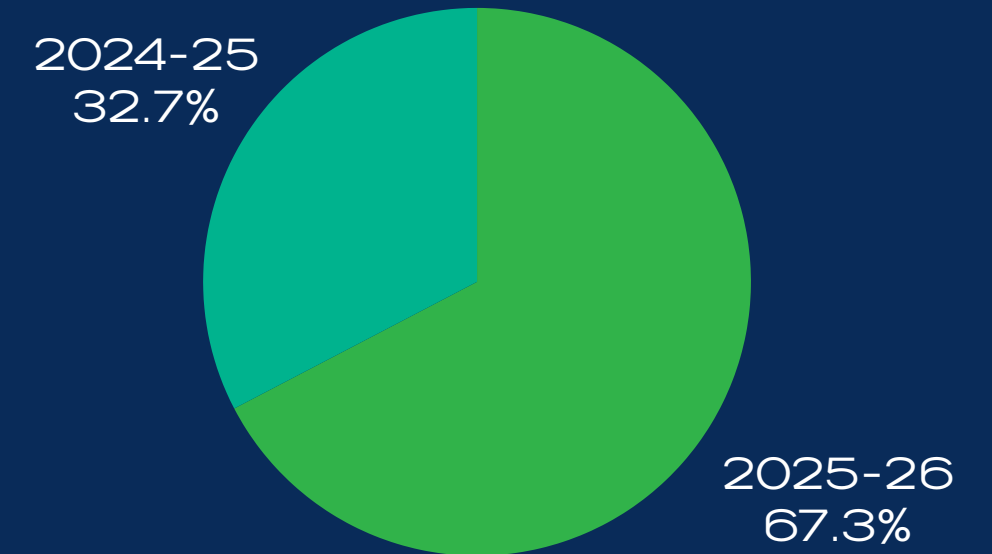

2025 AUSTRALIAN CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

We were excited to have 14 Athletics Southwest athletes represent Victoria at the Australian Cross Country Championships held in Ballarat last August.

This marked an increase of 10 athletes compared to 2024, reflecting incredible growth for our club and for the south-west region.

Highlights from the event include three top-10 finishes:

- Teyvia Williams (U20 F) - 5th
- John Davies (U12 M) - 7th
- Jarrod Ferguson (U18 M) - 9th

Other notable performances:

- Beau Morrison (U13 M) - 12th
- Harrison Watson (U13 M) - 14th
- Lenny Jansz (U12 M) - 19th

We also celebrated two masters athletes, Tamai Bremner and Caroline McDonald, who each won Gold in their respective F40 and F65 age groups!



2025 AUSTRALIAN CROSS COUNTRY RELAY CHAMPIONSHIPS

For the first time in ASW history, our athletes backed up the very next day to compete in the Australian Cross Country Mixed Relays.

In the U20 age group, Will Callaghan, Jarrod Ferguson, and Teyvia Williams teamed up with a fourth Victorian teammate (Ally Brooks BOH) to form a relay team they proudly named the Rubber Duckies. The quartet delivered a strong and consistent performance, working superbly together around the course to finish 3rd overall and claim the bronze medal.

In addition, Manaia Bremner and Occy Hayes, along with two other Victorians (Charlotte Staaks BAR and Chloe Grund KNA), finished 4th, a very respectable result. While Alaska Bremner joined an U14 team and helped them secure a top-10 finish.

In the Masters category, Tamai Bremner competed in the F40s team alongside three other Victorian runners. Demonstrating great determination and team spirit, they crossed the line in 3rd place, earning another bronze medal and capping off a highly successful weekend of racing for Victoria and ASW.



2025 AUSTRALIAN RACE WALKING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Alaska Bremner has quickly become a standout in the race walking community, meeting every challenge with remarkable confidence and determination.

In her debut year with the Turbines, Alaska made an immediate impact by claiming multiple state and national titles in race walking. In 2025, she secured two Victorian state titles and went on to win gold in the U12 division at the Athletics Australia Road Walking Championships in Ballarat, dominating her age group on the national stage.

So far this year, Alaska has earned three Victorian state medals and captured a silver medal at the ALAC Australian Track & Field Championships in the 1500m race walk, where she faced tough competition and gained valuable experience.

Notably, as an 11-year-old, Alaska has consistently raced up in the U14 category at state events, even defeating older U15 and U16 competitors on both the road and the track. Her impressive accomplishments are a testament to her exceptional talent, dedication, and bright future in the sport.





2025 NEW ZEALAND CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS

Teyvia Williams proudly donned the green and gold for the first time, representing Australia at the New Zealand Cross Country Championships on Saturday, 2nd August.

Competing in the U20 Women's 6km event, Teyvia finished 11th overall and played a crucial role in helping Team Australia secure the gold medal in the teams competition.

This achievement marks an outstanding milestone in Teyvia's career and serves as a wonderful source of inspiration for all our junior athletes.

This past season was Teyvia's last with us, as she has now relocated to Melbourne and is competing for Melbourne University. While we are sad to see her go, we are incredibly proud of everything she has accomplished and wish her every success in this next chapter of her running journey.

2026 AUSTRALIAN ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Seventeen South West athletes competed at the 2026 Australian Junior Athletics Championships in Brisbane in April, showcasing their talent across a range of events, including middle-distance, race walking, throwing, and jumping.

The team's efforts produced some fantastic results and highlighted the depth and versatility of our athletes on the national stage.

It was a strong championships across eight days of competition, with three athletes bringing home medals:

- Angus Ewing (U18) Discus - 1st
- Alaska Bremner (U12) 1500m Race Walk - 2nd
- Beau Morrison - (U13) High Jump - 3rd

2026 OCEANIA ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS

What a season it has been for Athletics South West's Angus Ewing!

Angus qualified for the 2026 Oceania Athletics Championships and secured his spot on the Australian team with a victory at the Australian Championships in Brisbane.

At the 2026 Oceania Athletics Championships in Darwin, Angus delivered a sensational performance to claim the U18 Men's Discus title and be crowned Oceania Champion.

He set the tone from the opening round, launching a massive personal best and championship record of 58.75m. Throughout the competition, four of his six throws were strong enough to win the event.

This result caps off an extraordinary six months for the South West athlete, who now adds the Oceania Championship title to his Australian All Schools and Australian National Championship victories. Angus's latest achievement also sees him rise to #12 in the World U18 Rankings.
